Dr. Lois Wilson has just published a book "I Want to Be in That Number-Cool Saints I Have Known"—a book of reflections on 40 remarkable "saints" she has encountered over her years as minister, church Moderator, Senator, and international ecumenical leader. Every story is anchored in the scriptural text chosen for their funeral, and includes Margaret Laurence and Anglican Primate Ted Scott as well as lesser known but faithful Christians. In a highly individualistic culture, this book it invites the reader to consider all that is implied about community in the phrase "communion of saints."
