PANTRY NEEDS: toilet tissue, Kleenex, flour, white/brown sugar, soda, salt, baking powder, canned vegetables and fruit, soup, canned meats and fish, granola bars, juice boxes, litre size juices, pasta sauce, mustard, relish, ketchup, waxed paper, tin foil, laundry soap, dish soap, cleaning supplies, coffee, cereal, oatmeal, soda crackers, pancake mix and syrup, pudding and fruit cups. We presently have 71 clients registered, they are broken down in categories as follows: 12 single women, 2 single men (seniors), 26 single parents with children, 22 families with 2 parents. If any client has not visited The Pantry in the past year their name is removed. Pantry Sunday is the first

Sunday of each month. It will be closed for the summer. June 29th is the last day before closing until August 3rd. Several people have asked for a "reverse offering" again. After the Offering, Pantry volunteers will pass around plates containing names of items for which we have the greatest need. Please return that item next week. The plates will be left at the doors afterwards. If you would like to take another or exchange the one you picked. The Pantry volunteers wish to extend a thank-you for all your support.
