Remit #1

Recently the Board of St. Paul's United Church voted on a church-wide Remit concerning the national church structure. Here's some information about the Remit and the vote.

What's a Remit anyway?

The General Council may change the Basis of Union only if the change is approved through a remit. A "remit" is a vote by presbyteries or by presbyteries and pastoral charges to change the Basis of Union. In the case of a pastoral charge vote, the Board (or equivalent governing body) reviews the information, engages in discussion, and votes either with or against the Remit.

Remit #1: Three Council Model

The United Church of Canada, organized as a three-council structure, would consist of communities of faith, regional councils, and a denominational council as follows:

Communities of Faith

A community of faith is any community of people within the United Church that:

- · gathers to explore faith, worship, and serve, including but not limited to pastoral charges, congregations, outreach ministries, chaplaincies, faith-based communal living, house churches, and online communities; and
- · is recognized as a community of faith within the United Church by the regional council through a covenantal relationship between the community of faith and the regional council.

Regional Councils

A regional council is a decision-making body responsible to serve and support communities of faith within its bounds and provide necessary oversight.

Denominational Council

The denominational council is the decision-making body for the United Church as both a denomination and a legal corporation.

This is different from the current model which is a four court system consisting of Pastoral Charges, Presbyteries, Conferences, General Council. To give some context, we are the St. Paul's United Church Pastoral Charge, and we exist within the bounds of Woolastook Presbytery, which is a part of Maritime Conference, and the General Council is the national body of The United Church of Canada.

That's not a lot to go on, how could the Board make a decision?

Also available on this page are links to other Remits that your Board will be addressing over the coming months, as well as study guides for the Remits, and some informational videos.

OK, so how did the Board vote?

After several meetings over a few months where the Remit was a topic of discussion, and with prayerful consideration, the Board of St. Paul's United Church voted to support the Remit moving forward.

So when does the change come into effect? Tomorrow?

The when is a little trickier. Every pastoral charge in The United Church of Canada has the right to vote on this Remit. Because of the denomination-shaping nature of the Remit, Presbyteries will also be voting (*The Manual, F 2.1.3*).

After all the voting, one of two things happen. If there is a majority of Pastoral Charges **and** a majority of all Presbyteries voting in favour of the Remit, it goes for final voting at the General Council level (*The Manual, F 2.2.7*). If the majority is not in favour (either by voting no or abstaining as that is counted as no), either at the Pastoral Charge or Presbytery level, the Remit is defeated.

Voting on this Remit must be concluded by June 30th, 2017 so that the General Council may decide whether or not to enact the Remit (should it pass) at the 43rd General Council in 2018. So when could this Remit take effect? As early as August, 2018.
