<u>August 13</u> <u>FREDERICTON PRIDE EVENT</u> August 13, 7:00. As part of the Pride Week, the Fredericton Pride Committee and the Playhouse are hosting a screening of *The Fruit Machine*, a documentary that captures the story of how the Canadian government outed and mistreated its LGBTQ2+ public servants, police and military personnel- people who had signed up to serve their country. It has been described as one of the largest bullying campaigns in Canadian history. Some of the New Brunswick survivors, and advocates who have worked tirelessly to bring the story and class-action lawsuit forward, will be on site to answer questions following the screening of the film.
