Seeking your thoughts! The St. Paul's Board is discussing a response to the Homelessness problem in Fredericton, specifically around those having to sleep in tents on freezing cold nights. We are considering opening our doors on nights where the temperature dips below –10 C to no more than 10 people in need. This sort of venture would require a minimum of 2 volunteers. The doors would be open from 8-9 PM and locked through the night. Those staying would be asked to vacate the church at 7 AM. The Board is asking the congregation to consider a test run for the month of December. Insurance inquiries are being made, and on nights without enough volunteers we won't open the doors. What we are asking from you is a simple "Yes" you are in favour of St. Paul's initiating this or "No" you are not in favour. In your bulletin is a piece of coloured paper with "Yes" on the top and "No" on the bottom. Please tear this sheet in half and place your response in the offering plate.
