CHURCH OFFERINGS: PAR

We encourage our members to make their offerings by using the PAR (Pre Authorized Remittance) system. 71 members are now using PAR and find it very convenient and easy to manage. Your Bank Account is charged monthly (20th of the month) by the amount you choose. No more envelopes, writing cheques or having the right amount of cash. Once signed up, future changes can be made by contacting the Church office. Financial report to November 30, 2018

Our weekly offerings to the end of November are \$212,000 and our budget to December 31 is \$288,000 leaving us \$76,000 below budget. December is usually a good contribution month but we wanted to bring the matter to your attention and solicit your assistance so that we can continue to share Gods love in worship and in our outreach.

Providing a Warm Space: We got a few volunteers signed up last week, but we would require more people who are committed to be part of the overnight supervision team to ensure we have enough people to make this work. If you will serve overnight for this outreach please sign up on the sheets in the Narthex and the Hall today. If you feel called to this work but there are barriers to your participating in this way, please speak to your Ministry Team about how you can help.

Land Acknowledgement: Many have been asking, why doesn't St. Paul's United do a Land Acknowledgment like those done in some other churches and organizations? This year the Worship Committee brought a motion to the Board to include a Land Acknowledgement at the beginning of every service. After lengthy conversation, prayer, and transformative reflection the Board agreed that a Land Acknowledgement is about more than words written and/or spoken. Ultimately, the Board decided that words without action were empty, and that moving forward without education could be harmful. As the United Church information on Land Acknowledgement states "Open hearts are needed to make this process authentic and meaningful" The Board is looking for people with a passion and energy to organize and lead the church in this process.
