**Pray:** Light a candle. Open your devotion with prayer.

**Read:** Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

*And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. (Acts 2:2)*



**Reflect:** Reflect on the scripture summary.

On Pentecost, God gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to those gathered, and in doing so they were able to discern voices speaking God's truth.



**Connect:** Connect in conversation with others in your household.

What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?

Have you ever been somewhere you didn't know the language? What was it like? Have you heard people speaking in new languages? How did that make you feel?

What gifts has the Spirit given you? How can you use those for sharing your faith?

For the littles: What makes you special? God gave you those gifts!



**Bless:** Close your devotion with a blessing.

May you feel the love you are given through the Holy Spirit. Amen.



**Do:** By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.
