Pantry Update: I wish to thank everyone who has donated non-perishable food, gift cards, and monetary donations to the Pantry over the past year. All the volunteers working in the Pantry appreciate your contributions. Thank you all so much. We have served 87 families over the past year. Included in these families are 65 children. When I do the count, I break it down into single women, 24, single men, 27, couples, 7, single parent, 18, families, 11, children, 65. Three volunteers work each Wednesday. Needy people can pick up a brown bag lunch every morning when the church hall is open. I keep 20 bags made up all the time.
