CALL TO WORSHIP: (Responsive) As we gather at these tables, Encircle us, O God, with your love. In keeping you close to our hearts, Keep the darkness at bay, Keep our fears away. In sharing this meal, we are filled with your love, Fill each here with your grace, Hold us safe in your embrace.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 26:17-19

HYMN: An Upper Room

An upper room did our Lord prepare for those he loved until the end: and his disciples still gather there to celebrate their risen Friend.

A lasting gift Jesus gave his own: to share his bread, his loving cup. Whatever burdens may bow us down, he by his cross shall lift us up.

And after supper he washed their feet, for service, too, is sacrament. In Christ our joy shall be made complete: sent out to serve, as he was sent.

No end there is! We depart in peace. He loves beyond the uttermost: in every room in our Father's house Christ will be there, as Lord and Host.

OPENING PRAYER:

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 26: 20-25

THE STORY BEFORE THE STORY: Matthew 26:2-16

REFLECTION: Why did you do it, Judas?

PRAYER OF CONFESSION: (In Unison)

Incarnate God, we yearn for Communion with you; for the hope of new life you offer, as we meet you face to face. Despite your open invitation, we find ourselves stumbling on our way. Forgive us, when we turn our back on you and when we seek our own vision instead of yours. You, Holy One, see our hearts and know us better than we know ourselves. In this silence, hear the prayers of our souls as we lift them to you. (*time of silence*)

WORDS OF ASSURANCE:

As you anoint the person next to you use the following words: May Christ be a seal upon your heart, for love is stronger than death.

INVITATION TO THIS TABLE:

PRAYER OF GREAT THANKSGIVING: (Responsive)

We thank you, God, Creator of us all; from the beginning, you made the world and all its creatures. You made people to live for you and for one another.

We praise you, O God.

You created Adam and Eve and gave them a garden; you showed Noah a rainbow; you gave Moses strength to free your people and taught Miriam to sing; you gave courage to Peter and loyalty to Mary Magdalene; you give us a voice to sing your praise, and light in our times of darkness.

We praise you, O God.

Yet, even the world turned away from you and forgot about you, as we often do too. But you did not forget. You sent Jesus to the world to show how much you love us and to bring us back to you again.

We praise you, O God.

He came as one of us, first an infant, then a child, later a youth, then an adult. He rejoiced with those who rejoiced, and wept with those who wept. To the despairing, he spoke a word of hope. To the sick, he gave healing. To the hurting, he was a friend.

We Praise you, O God.

Still, people turned away from you. They betrayed Jesus and nailed him to a cross. But he was lifted from the grave and restored to life, that he might be with us and we with him, alive forevermore! Therefore with all the saints of every time and place, we join the angels in their praise:

Holy, holy, holy, God of power and might Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest, Blessed is the One who comes in God's name.

INSTITUTIONAL NARRATIVE: Matthew 26:26-29

Lord, isten to your children praying, send us love, send us power, send us grace!

SHARING OF THE BREAD AND THE CUP (Responsive)

Come now for these are the gifts of God for the people of God **Thanks be to God** The body of Christ, through the broken bread we participate in the body of Christ.

We remember, and share in his sacrifice. (all partake of bread)

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE: Lord, Listen to Your Children Praying

The blood of the new covenant, through the cup of blessing, we participate in the new life Christ gives. We remember, and are humbled by his great love. (all partake of juice)

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION: (In Unison)

Responsive Chorus:

Holy God, at your table, we have touched, we have tasted and we have heard the signs of your love for us. May this meal sustain us as we seek to follow in your way. Grant that we may go away from this table filled with love for you and overflowing with love for those around us and who share our lives. This we pray in Christ's name. Amen.

HYMN: Now Let Us from This Table Rise (Tune ~ VU 149)

> Now let us from this table rise renewed in body, mind and soul; with Christ we die and live again, his selfless love has made us whole.

With minds alert, upheld by grace, to spread the word in speech and deed, we follow in the steps of Christ, at one with all in hope and need.

Then give us grace, Companion-God, to choose again the pilgrim way and help us to accept with joy the challenge of tomorrow's day.
